**“Is Divine Revelation = Solomon Syndrome”**

## R.

I would have to say that, although similar, Solomon Syndrome and Divine Revelation are different.

Solomon Syndrome would be like peering into Pandora's Box without letting everything out, and saying "I had no idea all of that was in there or that it even existed!" For me it was like a veil had lifted or that I had passed through a mirror. The perspective had changed to the point that I couldn't believe I had never seen it before. Some would say waking up. I would say seeing with a different lens or better yet, the lenses had been removed. I went through a period of anxiety or heightened awareness. I swear I heard every plane and helo that went over, where before I wasn't aware they were even flying overhead.

Divine Revelation, it seems to me, would be revealing some knowledge that links to a purpose. Now having gone through Solomon Syndrome, I feel like I get Revelations that lead me to the next step. A guide. Rather than the breakdown of having your legs knocked out from under you with Solomon Syndrome.

## **P.**

In Pi, the main character sees the patterns in everything and therefore unlocks the answers to everything. The film has explicit ties to Judeo-Christian religion, with his Solomon Syndrome being referred to as Divine Revelation in the language of God which is mathematics. Patterns are the signature of God in all nature.

With all this knowledge comes knowing the hard truths of the past, and the terrifying inevitability of the future. One who knows these truths simply cannot express them to other people. The knowledge is a burden and the connections or revelations happen in a thought-racing and mind-bending process.

As the rabbi says, divine revelation comes in ecstatic waves, however pain also comes in waves. The pain of Solomon syndrome comes in intense waves of realization about our insignificance in the universe and fear of understanding how much danger we are in as well as the true great potential of what we can achieve.

With Divine Revelation, God reveals his grandeur and one's true purpose which results in ego death. The same happens with Solomon Syndrome where everything one thought was important now isn't and they have to go through the waves of pain and ecstasy in rebuilding themselves with this new knowledge.

## M.

I watched 3 part homework involving revelation. I think out of the 3 videos the last was the best description where the Rabbi explains reading the Torah consistently and starting to receive revelation. If you believe in the oneness of God whether Jewish, Christian or Muslim you open yourself to have a connection with God and he will communicate with you. You bring yourself to a different state. The movie PI although intriguing the lady in the second video explains it best. Although they tried to explain the significance of numbers and the guys is constantly in an obsessives search I do not believe he was going through a divine revelation type event. Solomons syndrome is real and it does have to do with revelation. There are different stories that pertain to this. For example Prophet Mohamed going into the cave and the Angel Gabriel showing himself and giving him revelation and his response of uneasiness and going home in sweats and headache and not knowing what to do or believe. I cannot imaging how Soloman must have felt when receiving revelation and learning about djinns or to talk to animals or controlling the wind. That must have been one immense mind blow, or Moses when God himself spoke to him and him coming to the realization of what transpired.

I've been through a similar event when I came to the realization of how the world really worked. For two days my brain felt like it couldn't put ideas together just a constant state of mush thinking of the realization of maritime law and how the politicians never really meant anything that what really governed us was something else. It's like at first a firm of dissonance and then acceptance but that acceptance scrambles your brain as it tries to put all that you know together in a form to fit with the new reality you encounter. Very weird state to be in. I begged God to help me with my mind and that night had a dream where a guy came to me and put some stone over my forehead that was bright and next day I was fine. I don't know what to say but it was very weird experience which I cannot forget.

## M.

Solomon syndrome is the beginning stage of what may later be considered a "divine revelation," when the information is fully accepted and able to be applied. Solomon syndrome comes into play after acquiring new information, while attempting to process it; if there is no application for it, it gets either forgotten or rejected by the brain. This is a long process and definitely comes in waves. Just recently I had a second wave of it, after the death of a loved one. It took me by surprise, yet I was immediately able to identify it. I think it also gets easier and easier to handle as time increases. At least for me, it has.

"We are only the universe manifesting itself through physical form." The brain is the physical tool through which it gets "manifested" to our human senses. It is both a filter and also high in plasticity. Meaning, new information alters your filter and therefore what comes out through it. Information you do not have cannot come out through this filter and therefore does not get manifested because the neural pathways that would lead to having those specific thoughts have not been formed. From Pi: "The number is nothing. It's the meaning, the syntax, that is between the numbers.

If you haven't understood it, it's because it's not for you." If your brain has not been prepared to manifest the information into something, then the "revelation" cannot flow out through you.

My advice to new members: Solomon can take you down a rabbit hole where acquiring more information seems like the only way to begin to understand how to apply it. Meditation practice and times of rest, clearing the mind, can and absolutely do help to prevent this energy from turning into anxiety, allowing "revelation" to come through, aka allowing your brain to build pathways that will figure out how to best apply this information. Have patience with self, and try to pick the healthier coping mechanisms as a habit.

## S.

Disclosure: I have not watched the movie as I don't have Hulu Netflix etc but watched trailer and read up on plot storyline and it seems familiar I think I've watched it a long time ago. Reminds me of a different movie with a genius that has schizophrenia but the name eludes me... having said that:

Pi is a great example of Solomon syndrome. His over-obsessiveness and failure to listening to his mentor is what may be his greatest mistake. Divine revelation, as I understand to be smaller bits of knowledge/inspiration. A great person/(sage?) may receive a larger 'dose'...but it is meant as something that is to be used to do good with. Not just 'info' to obsess with. As far as divine revelation 'through' a person vs 'to' a person- perhaps that is what is meant when a great 'rabbi' utters a blessing or instruction to a follower -while he may not even be aware of why he is saying those words (that is what many hassidic followers believe)

(My dad has a lot of such stories with his rabbi...who's older brother says that as a boy he would see lights and colors around people and can see deep into their characters 'mazel' -and fates...while conducting himself with humility and joy. Anyhow I'm going off a tangent here, sorry)

As far as Solomon syndrome -when I joined doomsday awhile ago-I went through it, needed to recalibrate my basic belief system to search for contradictions so I could try to make sense of what was truth and what wasn't. I can say so much more but I respect your time and want to keep this concise.

## S.

In the question of whether Divine Revelation equals Solomon Syndrome, I would say no. They behave very similarly in effect, and could be equivalently disruptive forces for a person who experiences one or both. They each represent an encountering of a limit of perception or belief system, and breaking through it to a new level of awareness. However, in my opinion, the essential difference would be that Divine Revelation is of a transcendent nature, i.e., that the mind is released and itself dissolved into a gnostic atonement and unity, an experience of pure eternal consciousness. For me, that experience has led to a greater background of peace and purpose, and ability to take in the Great Mystery through both intellect and intuition, and have the moral rectitude to handle the knowledge. In contrast, I think of Solomon Syndrome as a shattering of the mind and the intellect, as if in trying to process new data, it could not contain the concepts it was trying to grasp. For me, that experience led to much more cognitive loops, and a striving to rebuild the architecture of belief systems or fundamental perceptions about the reality. There was much more effort.

In my experience, I would say Divine Revelation actually made Solomon Syndrome less severe because I made a good habit of letting everything, mundane and miraculous, light or shadow, blow my mind open to greater systems of knowledge and seeing the divine blueprint everywhere. In Pi, Max experiences Solomon Syndrome first, attempting to process what the meaning of the finding was through only his intellect, and it led to a breaking of his mind on a psychological level. Later, after his self-inflicted trauma, he does seem to go through a Divine Revelation of sorts. On the bench in the final scene, his mind is at peace, and not wrestling to understand and calculate what he's experiencing, but rather just to be present in the moment. In that moment with the little girl, he's embodying the notion of letting the Revelation live through him instead of chasing the Revelation.

## C.

DR is not the same as SS, but they are strongly tied.

A revelation, divine or non-divine, will shake your beliefs. You're getting new insights that challenge hard, what you believed up until that point.

SS is the effect of the revelation. The brain tries to sort out where to put that new belief system.

Both hit you, the closer you get to the true core. You understand. You see patterns and see why things happen.

If you can handle it, the syndrome fades. Knowledge sinks in.

The risk is that one gets a Solomon syndrome so hard, that one closes completely to remain „normal“.

That's what happened to Max in Pi.

A divine revelation he couldn't process.

But once the revelation (divine or non-divine) is processed, it won't ever fade like the SS does.

## **K.**

I think Divine revelation and Solomon syndrome go hand in hand. When there is Divine revelation beyond one's own understanding, one experiences Solomon syndrome.

It feels like something old has gone, and a new purpose and destiny comes.

When Solomon syndrome is experienced, one can either reject the Divine revelation out of fear and confusion, or welcome it and allow it to further itself through his or her life.

## H.

The solomon syndrome and the divine revelation.

The biggest common threads in these two are the fact that both are caused by learning deep truth about the world one finds themselves in, as well as how for one having such experience it becomes very difficult or next to impossible to communicate it to those who have not had such experience, as even when communicated the recipient of such communication lacks knowledge gained through the experience to grasp and understand precisely what is being communicated.

The similarities between the two suggest that they could be one and the same process, what differs between them is the origin. One comes from a metaphysical experience leading to gaining more knowledge, the other from knowledge being revealed in non metaphysical/spiritual way. This fundamental difference suggests these two processes although greatly similar are different.

## E.

[#Homework](#) - Solomon Syndrome > Divine Revelation Solomon Syndrome has been an experience of intense informational load. It seems, as seen in Pi, overwhelming at times. Headaches, poor sleep and constant questions have ensued. However, it is also a period of being open – “empty your cup.” Make room for new learning by removing old habits, thoughts and beliefs. As changes occur, in my experience, a different way of being has taken place; a type of calm from dots connecting and the universe making more sense. Divine Intervention is occurring as knowledge builds.

I do not believe that Solomon Syndrome is the same as Divine Revelation. I feel that Solomon Syndrome is the first of three steps to the overhaul that is taking place. The second step is Divine Intervention to help process and make sense of the information allowing further building of depth of knowledge. The final step is Divine Revelation in which one can then share the information and assist others through their journey beginning with Solomon Syndrome. Divine Revelation is experienced by being an example and conduit of the information.

## E.

Divine revelation could be the act of knowing or revealing of information that goes against one's own belief. Then Solomon syndrome is the reaction to the after effects of divine revelation. Rejecting the information, headaches, drinking, committing suicide, fear etc.

Though I haven't gone through Solomon syndrome because I have been taking the information in bit by bit.

It's like some neurons light up in my brain and at that moment I realize the truth or see it. So my brain struggles to accept it as a fact and at the same time reject it. This brings conflict within me and leaves me in a very confusing state. I can't tell the difference and this alone scares me. You can't tell anyone what you are going through because to them maybe it doesn't make sense or you will look like someone who's losing his mind. So what do you do next. You isolate yourself thinking it may help, but it only makes it worse.

Sometimes ignorance is bliss, then again we humans are driven by the need to know. When we don't know we are driven by a strong need to know and when we know, we can't handle it. In the end some people behave irrationally, like driving a power drill in the head.

## V.

For me, divine revelation can come in many forms but is similar in the 'aha' moments or the piecing together of signs, clues, epiphanies, leading to a deeper interpretation and understanding of reality. Or perhaps a wider, overall picture of reality through the little details and puzzles in our daily life when they are put together to form an overall bigger picture. It can come through meditation or reflective thought. It can be channelled through writing and I have written poems or pieces of writing over the years in these varying degrees of deep states. It can feel liberating, heart opening, or euphoric at times that sometimes later surprisingly I can read back on it and not fully grasp the meaning or the deep transformation that it gave me at the time I wrote it!

Solomon Syndrome feels more like normal reality (or the illusory world we live in) interfacing with a different reality, actual reality, infinite reality. For me it can feel like the two interfaces have crashed into one another. It feels brutal, unsettling, like the ground being ripped from beneath my feet. Usually it feels like my existence has been shattered in some way. That 'all this' is temporary or an illusion, a dream and I am more than just an insignificant human body. The most prominent example of this would be when I did Ayahuasca about 3 years ago. It was like my life from the point I decided to 'become spiritual' to that moment was the Truman Show. That nothing was accidental and everything had meaning. One example I can remember is that I happened to be sitting next to Sigrid Thornton (an Australian Actress) and on the drive to the retreat I had passed a town called Thornton and I was shown how that was not a coincidence. During the journey I could not purge (vomit) as I was fighting this knowledge and wished I had not asked and could "not know" again. Then I did finally purge and every sense of who I was, was ripped away from me even further. I saw everyone in the room as myself, even the Shaman whose name was (not coincidentally I realised) Sarah as well. It was a long journey with many revelations but space and time eventually returned. The first aspects to return was the land in which I was on. I realised the Aboriginal ancestors of the land were somehow involved in this. I was grateful to them in my new tiny understanding of that. It also gave me a new appreciation of this world as a dream as I had experienced existence as the only one in the eternal.

In the movie Pi, the main character Max has knowledge and access to higher levels of information, but the environment in which he has grown up and lived in, did not give him the ability to deal, process or integrate this knowledge.

Because Max does not have the tools to integrate his growth and knowledge of the key ingredients in the universe that he is finding out through mathematics, he has physical symptoms. He gets so close to 'god' that he trembles as his body is filled (possibly) with kundalini, life force energy. The movie expresses and symbolises this with the sexual

moaning before he hits “enter” on his keyboard, with the anticipation, the raw ingredients of creation in the universe swirling around in him. But he does not know how to move these energies through him, nor be with the riddle of existence as his mind races into infinity trying to find the answer. His only tool to stop these overwhelming effects is drugs. He also does not know how to switch his mind off and this is represented in the end with him drilling a hole in his head, the scar representing a switch. I can sometimes feel that my mind is racing into infinity as it grapples with a problem and is trying to find an answer. Especially the problems that face us in this current world climate.

Solomon syndrome feels like I desperately need to find the answer, to desperately make the right choice, to desperately figure “it” out. As more is revealed to me and I am processing it then and there, I am trying to find the answer, now! My mind races, as new information is revealed to me and my mind races into infinity trying to get the answer. As so much seems to depend on that answer and my right course of action as a result of the answer I hope to find or I am on the edge of finding. Then something drops in, a little reminder, that this urgency might not be as urgent as I am leading myself to believe. That there is this magic little technique of breathing, focussing on the breath and relaxing, where upon your mind stops racing, you let go of the urgency, almost forget the puzzle or problem and the answer drops in although you kind of need to let go of finding the answer for this to happen.

If I am safeguarding myself with proper energetic set up, prayer, respect for the unseen world, I find that I am actually helped in these moments and little helpers will come to me or I will remember to focus on them and they will have a teaching, a message or just some offer of comfort that will help give me the right answer in the end. It always usually comes from nature, but messages can come through any means. When I used to be on facebook for example, a meme or something would come at the right moment through synchronicity. Staying humble, grounded and connected to all things helps as sometimes the mind would have us believe we are completely alone in our quest. It's like learning to walk that fine balance between surrender and guidance whilst still employing our will to take right action.

This came through me the other day with the message of pray, receive, give. This relates to the second video of the Jewish man talking about the Torah and divine revelation coming through you. For me the giving in this does not detract anything from the person doing the giving. It is like the cosmic breath of the universe breathing in and out. Receive love, Give love and the prayer is the intent and the direction for us to be in right relationship with all.

I guess with 'knowledge' which might ultimately just be the knowledge of 'self', we have the ability to choose what we create. Literally heaven or hell. The movie Pi refers to this when the Jewish Rabbi and followers are trying to get Max to tell them the number as it is the key to The Garden of Eden. But Max understands this number on a cellular and soul level and says it is not the actual number but the syntax and the pause between the number as well (or something to that effect). He knows it's the journey and the effort of finding it as much as the actual number itself. He knows the responsibility that comes with that knowledge and that ultimately might be why he makes the decision to drill the hole in his head because he knows he is creating a nightmare for himself. Through his 'runaway mind' with paranoid thoughts he is literally creating a kind of hell existence for himself. At the end of the movie, he is appreciating the leaves rustling on the trees, the small seemingly insignificant things in life which really seems like he has got the point of existence to some degree. He is appreciating the company of the girl whereas previously he just gave her an answer to get away from her. The movie seems to make a point of the importance of this knowledge being in the right hands with that pushy woman from that company as well as even the religious Jewish people desperately trying to get it. I guess where that comes into how knowledge is used, whether it's for self serving purposes or for the greater good and for just wanting to know. Max makes a point that he isn't interested in finding the number for material personal gain. It feels that the movie makes a point that there is a worthiness element to the gift of true knowledge. Max finds that self worth within himself when he refuses to give the number to the religious Jews.

## **B.**

Edited to answer questions 2-3

Q1: Is Divine Revelation = Solomon Syndrome?

Answer: No. My understanding is that Divine Revelation is a paradigm shift in perception/reality. Solomon Syndrome is one response to the paradigm shift. So one precedes the other, you can't have SS if you haven't received some new information to change your perception. Also, the guy in the third video discusses allowing Divine Revelation to work "through you"...another indication that you can share/act on this knowledge to help others like Prometheus Fire - an alternative outcome to Solomon Syndrome.

Q2: Personal experience with Divine Revelation or Solomon Syndrome?

Answer: For me revelations occur in personal relationships and understanding changes in global politics/economics.

1) For example, having kids makes me realize what my parents had to go through. So the empathy allows me to understand that relationship from a completely different vantage point.

2) Investing and losing money during the housing bubble allowed me to really question what I knew about the world and economy. I was already a skeptic but still believed in a naïve laissez-faire market was running the show.

3) Watching Bitcoin take off these past years. Wish I knew about your forum sooner because I was absolutely convinced Bitcoin was a honeypot back in 2012. I almost bought to HODL with some friends but decided between Silk Road and watching alt currencies get whacked (not to mention countries like Libya). I decided NOT to go that route. Was already thinking social credit score back then.

Q3: How do I handle either?

Answer: I went through Solomon Syndrome a couple times between 2008 - 2012. What I've learned is that I got stuck in SS when I had information that I wasn't able to turn into actionable intel.

I think I'm getting better and discerning general intel vs actionable, and I feel your channels have helped tremendously these past several months. So too much noise and we all experience analysis paralysis.

Divine Revelations: When you're the only one in your inner circle with a different outlook or set of risk assessments it seems odd to others. I've grown pretty comfortable in embracing the awkwardness. Generally I try to match people's curiosity and not be overbearing. "You can lead a horse to water but you can't force them to drink." or in your case, "you can lead us to the door but we have to open it."

I wrote a bunch more and ended up clipping out how I explain DR vs SS, but if you want I can paste than in separately.

Thoughts about DR/SS:

I like Neil DeGrass Tyson's "3 Truths" approach and I'll add one more (for completeness)

- 1) Objective Truth - Truth about nature/reality/science that are universally proven
- 2) Personal Truths - Truth about a subjective experience, opinions. Unverifiable but can be "true" based on your perspective
- 3) Political Truths - Lies/stereotypes pretending to be true
- 4) Unknown/Undefined Truths - All other 'stuff' not listed above

Scenario 1: Let's assume Divine Revelation is a relative term. Also, let's define a paradigm shift as something that moves from one Truth bucket to another.

Now for an example - you believe 9/11 (Truth #2) was a terrorist plot but somewhere along the way you discover new information that conflicts with that narrative, you can choose to put the new information in #3/4 Truth bucket or you can replace your #2 belief with the new explanation for 9/11.

When the frequency/intensity of these changes stack up it becomes more significant. Also, when you move something from the #3/4 to a #1, that's a big change (you'll probably need to dump some other #1 convictions you held on to).

Maybe when you start swapping out large chunks of #1/2 Truths with #3/4, you experience Divine Revelations (relative to your own experience). The feedback loop to this cycle could get out of hand (discoveries leading to more discoveries increasing in intensity/frequency) and now you are left with Solomon Syndrome, caused by your Divine Revelations.

Scenario 2: Let's assume Divine Revelation is the absolute term (singularity). To say (DR = SS) is to say we have no control over our response to DR. By fate we are programmed to self-destruct upon exposure.

Summary: I believe in scenario 1, divine revelation is local/relative to the person's experience. Scenario 2 doesn't make sense to me, because I like to think we have

choices. Therefore I rule it out based on my bias opinion, but I don't see any objective way to resolve whether S2 is True or not.

Ways to reduce chance of experiencing SS (hit those self help books ~sarc):

Be comfortable with uncertainty - most things people hold as #1 Truths are actually #2 because we're lazy and defer the proof to an "expert" (scientist/historian etc), therefore people holding lots of #1 Truths are hit harder by shift.

1) Pace yourself. Human nature is less resistant to gradual change overtime (examples: fitness, education, social norms ect).

2) Discover #1 truths yourself. Become more self-sustaining, experiment and prove to yourself the reality. Be careful with relying on MM experts for #1 Truths.

3) Be humble + have less (unhealthy) ego - the cost of shifting paradigm will be less and therefore you have more capacity to change/adapt. People that hold on too hard to their #1/2 Truths are brittle - need to be fluid.

4) Understand the cost of acquiring new (good or bad) paradigm shifting information. Self awareness allows you to understand what you are trading (time, relationships, sanity, priorities, etc).

## J.

In my view, Solomon Syndrome is a symptom of divine revelation—particularly when the revelation is contrary to one's prior worldview. There is an internal struggle when attempting to square the truth of divine revelation with past influences and teachings which conflict. Changing one's life in accordance with the revelation may lead to hardships and personal struggle when the truth revealed by the divine means adopting new values not readily accepted by society. To change one's life in this way requires extreme faith in the revelation and its divinity. However, once this faith is realized, the Solomon Syndrome will subside to reveal a transformation of the individual into a better, more divine version of themselves.

In this way, divine revelation is the catalyst for positive change. With true insight into the nature of the universe, we can all better ourselves and add true value to the universe. We are all gods in the chrysalis attempting to understand the ineffable and infinite glory of creation through our gifts of reason and intuition. Solomon Syndrome is akin to this chrysalis because it represents internal change. Divine revelation—and even the Solomon Syndrome which may accompany it—are necessary aspects of this supreme clockwork devised by the infinite consciousness in its process of understanding itself. Once the individual mind has accepted the divine through sufficient revelation, it may act in direct accordance with divinity for the betterment of all unencumbered by negativity, doubt, and fear.

Divine revelation is the point of it all. The divine bringing you into Union with itself as a parent would a child. Teaching your soul how to be Godlike. You can then help others bring themselves into Union!

**N.**

I feel that solomon syndrome is divine revelation, just like the many divine revelations we have every day. I'm not particularly religious but I do believe in the concept of god, a creator and designer of the universe, because the universe is too intelligently designed for it to have just happened randomly or coincidentally with no input. Therefore everything in the universe is divine, and any revelations we have are divine. They can be small or may seem insignificant, or they can be huge and mind-blowing. I already knew and researched about many of the topics we have gone over, including ancient civilizations and ancient astronauts, and that there are cycles/ages to human civilizations, and that black projects have been working on secret space projects like the TR-3B. To me all these revelations were divine, but they were not that huge or mind-blowing, because I had these realizations piece by piece, not all at once. Researching and digging deeper in one topic led to another topic, because they were interconnected to each other. The more and more I researched I saw that all these different topics in hidden history were interconnected like a spider web. I could see that mainstream society is lying and hiding the truth.

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I often hear the statement, “perception is reality.” This is of course a misnomer, to the individual perception is what he believes to be reality. “Reality is merely an illusion, albeit a very persistent one,” Albert Einstein. True reality is the world that surrounds everyone regardless of their personal perception. In order to deal with reality, you must first see it as true and not as the illusion of your perception.

Solomon Syndrome is described as the initial shock of experiencing a world unlike everything they were taught and personally believed resulting in erratic behavior and intense internal dialogue of the experience. Defined as a Black world term for individual going through a new unbelievable environment. Often described by outside observer that witnesses someone experiencing Solomon Syndrome in a frozen state unable to react to their surrounding environment because of the internal disbelief of what they are seeing with their own eyes.

The challenge for a person prior to experiencing Solomon Syndrome is to determine what is perception and what is true reality. A simple example would be during the day the world is brighter than at night. My perception would be that everything glows brighter for a limited time during a 24 hour period. My illusion would be that objects glow to produce the day. True reality is the light from the earth’s closest star, the sun, is responsible for the time period we refer to as day. That light is what causes the world to illuminate for a limited time during a 24 hour period. Solomon Syndrome would be not knowing the Sunrise starts the day, being taught that the sun has nothing to do with the daytime illumination and then witnessing it for the first time at dawn.

Growing up I experienced the world as I was told to experience it. Almost by definition this would mean that my experiences are not my own they are the perception of world of those who had control over my environment, my world views. The conundrum is how do I experience the world without the influence of those who would only want me to see it as they feel fit for me to see it and experience my true reality. In the movie Pi the main character Max is in a constant run for his life do to his revelation of the world. Groups with specific agendas were constantly pursuing him for his knowledge and how that his knowledge can help them achieve their selfish goals. In the end of the movie his only perceived escape from a life of constant pursuit was to lobotomies himself, losing not his knowledge of the real workings of the world but his ability to be a full functional sentient being.

Rabbi David Solomon discusses on how receive a Divine Revelation through you. He describes on how an individual being is a revelation on to the world itself. This

manifest in the behavior of a person or even a people in Rabbi David Solomon's own words, "The most important thing in the world is how God is reviled through the Jewish people. How do the Jewish people make the world a better place? How do the Jewish people survive through history to revile the oneness of the divine? How do the Jewish people get on amongst themselves? How do the Jewish people transform the concept of nationhood into something that is Holy and brings peace to the world? Those are the revelations that come through us. Not just to us."

How does someone awaken to the true reality and dismantle the illusion that was placed there by those who had control over you? It would seem that history and religion is full of accounts of a people that experienced a Divine Revelation through them from a divine source. Moses and the commandments and Plato's republic are examples an idea of how the world really should be and they both felt compelled to share their revelation with the world. A contrast to the description of Solomon Syndrome where the true reality of the world is reviled in a cataclysmic revelation causing cognitive dissents.

"Human beings, By changing the inner attitudes of the mind, can change the outer aspects of their lives." William James, US philosopher & psychologist. In conclusion, I was taught the best way to invoke a change on a personal level is to go through the five stages of behavior change: precontemplation, contemplation, preparation, action and maintenance. Before I started on this homework assignment I would have agreed that these psychological steps were all that was needed to create a change in myself. I am a practicing Christian in North America and through the church I was taught to go to God first and seek his advice in all matters. After this assignment I would addendum the five steps of behavior change to include Divine Revelation for a purpose higher than myself and ask the same questions laid out by Rabbi David Solomon. How do I make the world a better place? How will I survive through history? How can I even transform the concept of nationhood into something that brings peace to the world?
